Some are challenged to meet basic needs, others appear to have all the resources and support they need. The one thing they do have in common, that we ALL have in common: we sometimes make choices that cause harm, large or small. What matters most is how we move forward and who we choose to be.

**37 Community Impact Circles** - Restorative Practice at its finest, bringing together teens, parents, and community to talk about action, impact, and moving forward after harm has been caused





**Mentorship** - A new collaboration with Big Brothers Big Sisters, pairing a CRYJ teen with a community volunteer

**Documentary Showing:** "Circles" - CRYJ hosted Eric, the restorative justice practitioner at rhe center of the film, and a great dialogue about restorative practices in schools and communities

**Holiday Art Stroll** - Featuring the art of teens from several communities in the Valley

**Great Fish Challenge success!** - CRYJ had a blast raising awareness and support for lots of cool Flathead Valley non-profit organizations


